IS THE MYP GOOD PREPARATION FOR THE DP?

- The MYP is flexible enough to accommodate most national or local curriculum requirements. It builds upon the knowledge, skills and attitudes developed in the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP) and prepares students to meet future academic challenges, including the IB Diploma Programme (DP).
- MYP topic lists have been created with DP curriculum in mind.
- In a 2015 study, the Australian Council of Educational Research concluded: "Students with MYP background were found to outperform students who participated in other middle years curricula in total diploma points and specific DP subjects."

- Higher mean performance of MYP students compared to non MYP students
- Improved performance in TOK (Theory of Knowledge)
- The community project especially helps students with the service component of CAS

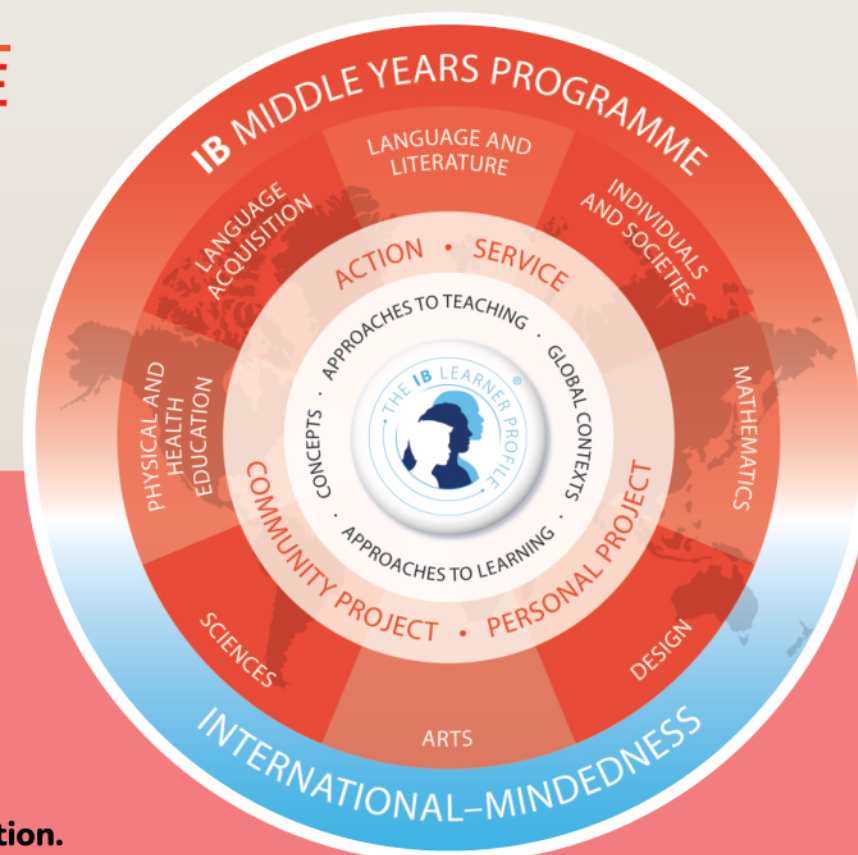


WHAT IS MYP ? MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAMME Grade 6 to Grade 10

- The MYP is a challenging framework that encourages students to make practical connections between their studies and the real world.
- It provides a framework of learning that encourages students to become creative, critical and reflective thinkers.

INTERDISCIPLINARY LEARNING

GRADES 6 TO 10

At least one collaboratively planned interdisciplinary unit at each year of the MYP in order to integrate knowledge and skills from two or more subject groups in an interdisciplinary manner.

SERVICE AS ACTION

GRADES 6 TO 10

- Action is learning by doing and experiencing. Service is part of action and it is where IB learners strive to be caring members of the local and global community, by demonstrating personal commitment to services that make a difference to the lives of others and the environment.
- Learners need to meet the 7 learning outcomes of service as action during their MYP journey.

PERSONAL PROJECT

GRADE 10

- The personal project encourages students to practice and strengthen their approaches to learning (ATL) skills, to consolidate prior and subject-specific learning, and to develop an area of personal interest in Grade 10.
- The students produce a personal and often creative product/outcome and demonstrate a consolidation of their learning in Grade 10.
- Students can choose any topic as per the Person interest.
- Student is expected to prepare a product and report for the same.

IS THE MYP EQUIVALENT TO 10th IN INDIA?

YES, It has been recognised by AIU-Association of Indian Universities.

Middle Years Programme (MYP) conducted by International Baccalaureate Organisation, Geneva, Switzerland has been equated with Grade 10 of an Indian Board for the purpose of admission to higher studies in a school in India since 2013.



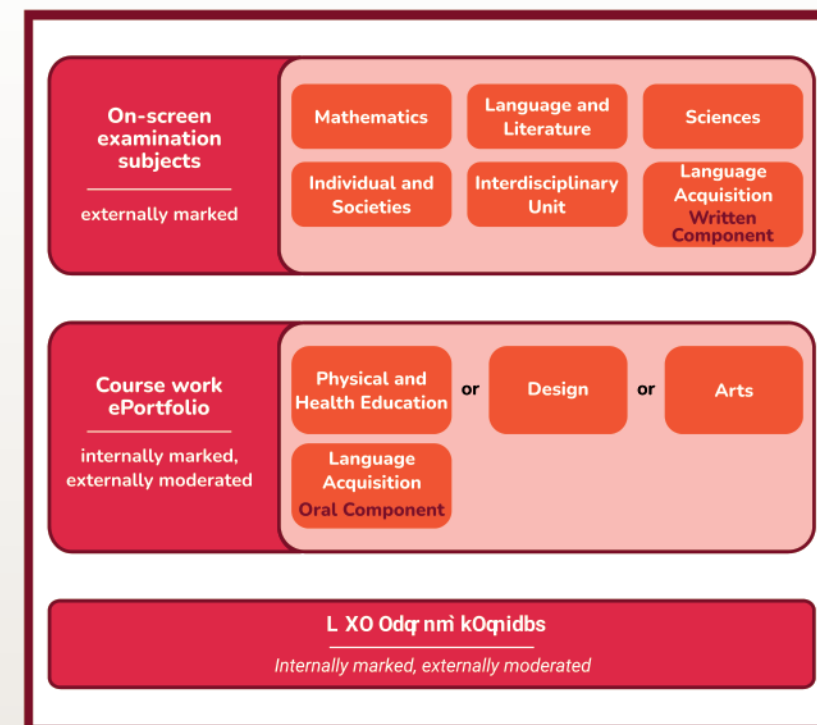
HOW DOES THE MYP STAND IN COMPARISON TO OTHER QUALIFICATIONS, LIKE IGCSE / CBSE / STATE BOARDS?

In comparison to other programmes, the MYP is unique in the way that it is developmentally-g geared toward the needs of younger adolescents. MYP students are not only academically challenged but also personally nurtured to prepare them for the future and to contribute to a global society. The MYP Assessments focus on understanding and critical thinking, not rote memory.

MYP EASSESSMENT IN GRADE 10

The onscreen exams that students will be appearing and course work they submit in Grade 10 - End of MYP Programme.

MYP eAssessment has been developed for students and schools that need external verification of student achievement at age 16. It strengthens the continuum and offers students formal, recognized qualifications.

- Contextualised and authentic
- Inter-disciplinary assessments
- Uses multimedia and interactive activities; bringing assessments in-line with 21st century learning
- Internationally recognized IB MYP Certificate

HOW DO STUDENTS ACHIEVE THE MYP CERTIFICATE?

- The maximum total score for the IB MYP certificate is 56, with a grade from 1-7 assigned to each required eAssessment.
- Students must achieve a total of at least 28 points, with a grade of '3' or higher in each eAssessment component, to be eligible for receiving the IB MYP certificate.
